The presented data concern the employment characteristics of two groups of professions related to the area of culture: 1) authors, journalists and linguists (according to the international standard for the classification of professions ISCO-08, code 264) and 2) creative and performing artists (code 265). For simplicity, both groups were called "artists and authors". Code 264 includes the following professions and specialties: (2641) authors and related writers, (2642) journalists, (2643) translators, interpreters and other linguists. Code 265 includes the following professions and specialties: (2651) visual artists, (2652) musicians, singers and composers, (2653) dancers and choreographers, (2654) film, stage and related directors and producers, (2655) actors, (2656) announcers on radio, television and other media, (2659) creative and performing artists not elsewhere classified.
