Consumer prices in July 2026 increased by 3.0% compared with the corresponding month of the previous year (with an increase of prices of services by 5.5% and goods by 2.0%). As related to the previous month consumer prices increased by 0.8% (of which services by 1.4% and goods by 0.6%).

The consumer price index in July in annual terms (103.0) was the same as published in the flash estimate

NOTE: Starting with data for 2026, the CPI is calculated according to the international COICOP 2018 classification.

Contributions of price changes to the total consumer price index

In July of the current year, compared with the previous month, the highest contribution to the total consumer price index came from higher prices related to: Transport (by 7.4%), Recreation, sport and culture (by 3.6%) and Information and communication (by 1.6%), which increased the index by: 0.73 pp, 0.23 pp and 0.08 pp, respectively. Lower prices related to Food and non-alcoholic beverages (by 0.8%), Clothing and footwear (by 4.1%) and Personal care, social protection and miscellaneous goods and services (by 0.4%) decreased the index by 0.20 pp, 0.15 pp and 0.02 pp, respectively.

Compared with the corresponding month of the previous year, higher prices related, among others, to: Housing, water, electricity, gas and other fuels (by 4.5%), Transport (by 7.0%), Recreation, sport and culture (by 5.4%), Alcoholic beverages and tobacco (by 6.9%), Health (by 4.9%) as well as Information and communication (by 5.2%) increased the index by: 0.91 pp, 0.71 pp, 0.35 pp, 0.33 pp, 0.30 pp, and 0.26 pp, respectively. Lower prices related to Clothing and footwear (by 3.6%), Food and non-alcoholic beverages (by 0.4%) and Furnishings, household equipment and routine household maintenance (by 0.6%) decreased the index by 0.13 pp, 0.11 pp and 0.03 pp, respectively.

Chart 1. Contribution of price changes of selected groups of consumer goods and services in July 2026 (change in pp compared with the previous period)

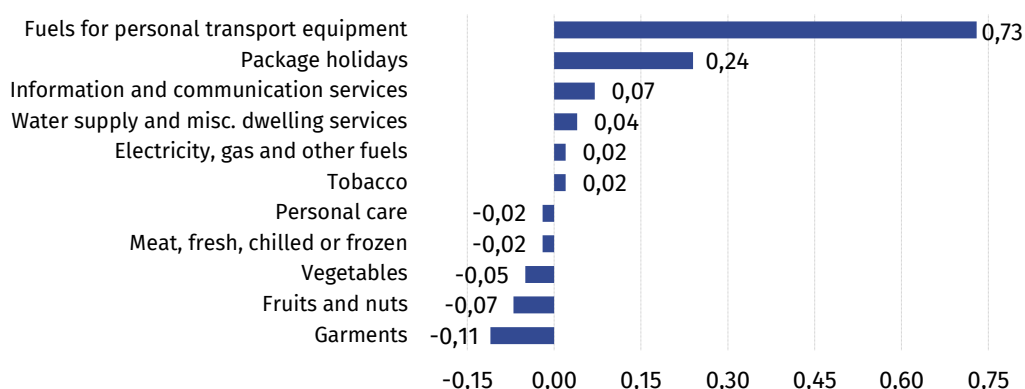


Chart 2. Weighting system used in the compilations of consumer price indices in 2026

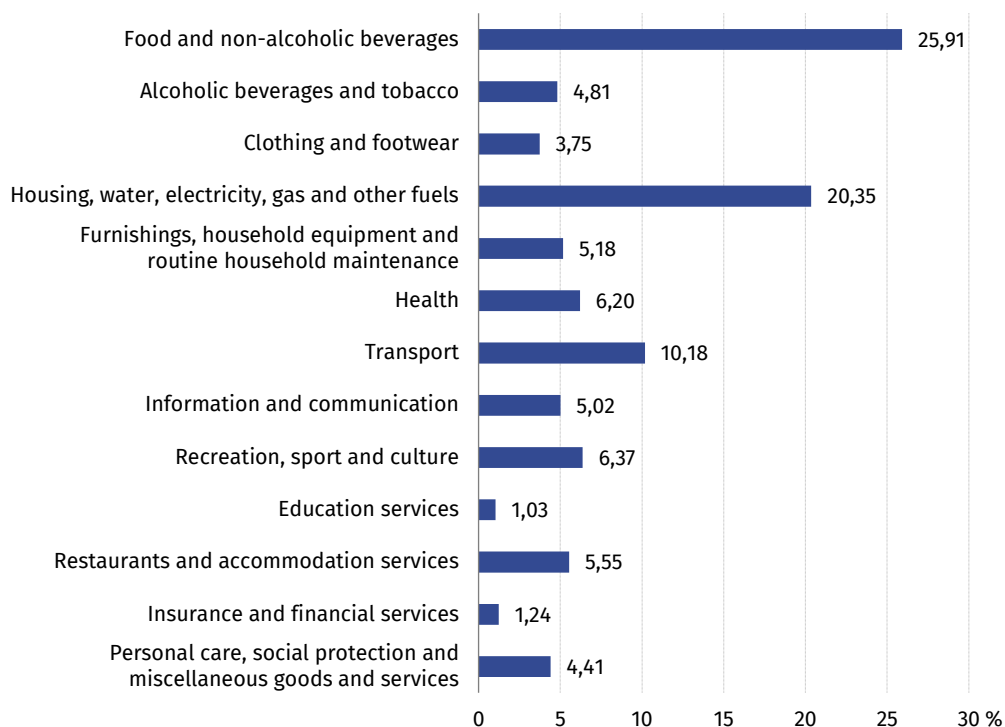


Chart 3. Changes in consumer prices as related to the previous month (in %)

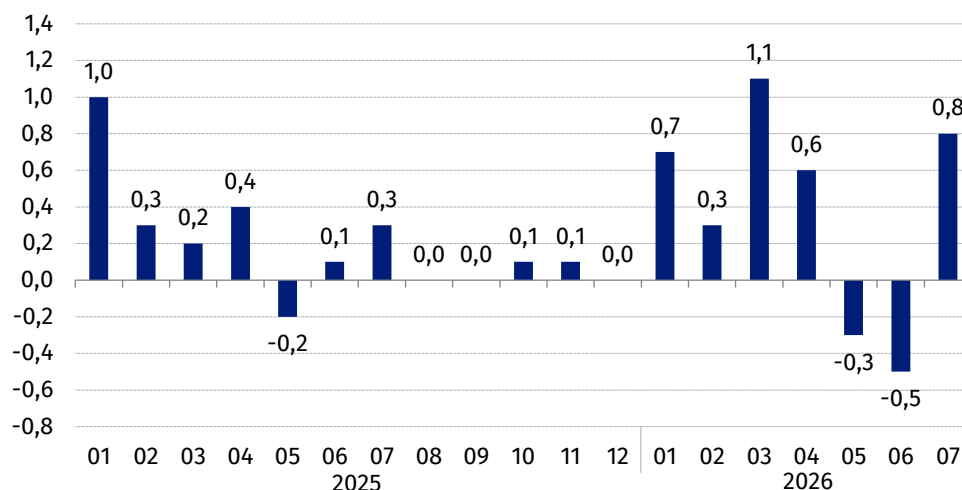
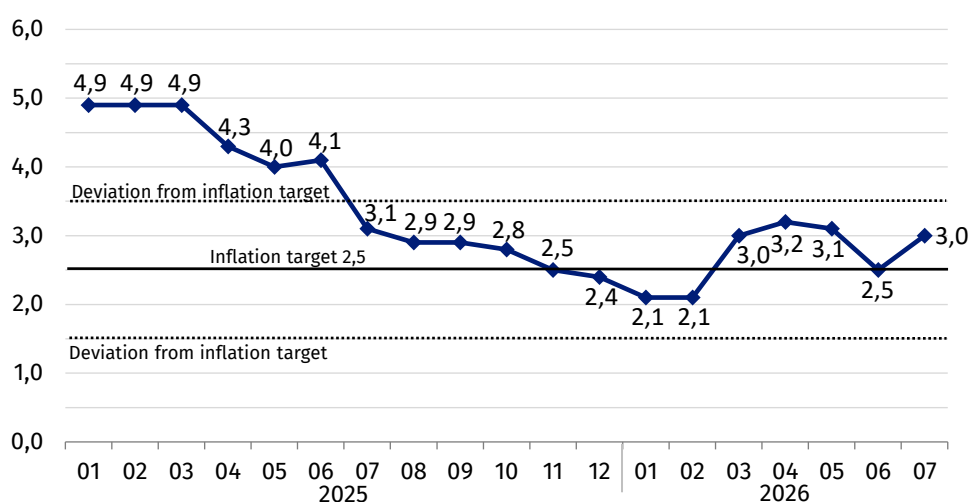
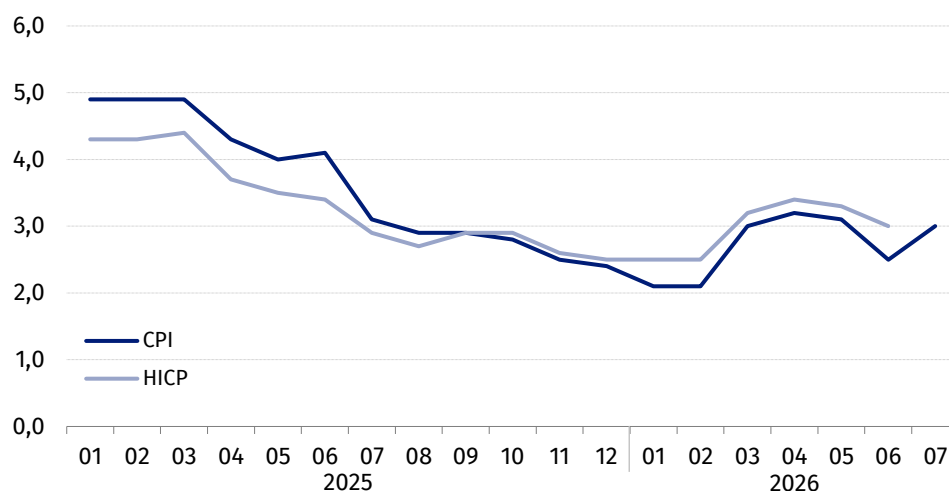


Chart 4. Changes in consumer prices as related to the corresponding period of the previous year (in %)
